The Locus of Control Shift

- Feeling helpless is
 intolerable. Shifting to an
 internal LOC compensates
 for feelings of
 powerlessness and loss of
 control
- Can lead to entrenched self-blame but also serves a protective function

 behind the symptoms
 and behaviors they

 purpose
- The presenting
 problems is a solution
 to a problem in the
 background



"I can fix that"
